Mr Jay has appealed against his enforcement notice.

After speaking to Viv Bebbington, she informs me that the Parish Councils should all be getting the same notification. A public enquiry will be held (date TBC) and the Planning Inspectorate will review the appeal once a date has been agreed (again TBC).

Mr Jay has still not submitted the outstanding details for his revised planning application, so this is still not 'live'.

The Breckland Council appeals officer Katie Arnold, who works Monday-Wednesday, is dealing with this case. She is sending letters to all who formally commented previously but as this has to be done manually and is not an automated system, there seems to be a bit of a delay.

I plan on speaking to her next week, so will update you with any new details.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING.

This event took place on May 16th in the usual Village meeting place, in attendance there were seven members of the public, four councillors and Stan Hebborn our new County Councillor, who in his address to the gathering promised to support Ovington, in particular our attempts to provide a footpath to Watton.

Reports were read out from all the active Village groups, where the general outlook for all of them was promising. However not to appear complacent all groups emphasised the need for more members.

The Parish Council Chairman's report reflected on a quite successful year with the signing of an agreement with the Allotment association, giving them control over the running of the allotments. The Jubilee celebrations planned entirely by the councillors was an outstanding success, despite the inclement weather. The Chairman praised the efforts of former councillor, John Hardy, who was the driving force behind the success of both the aforementioned events. The next major project for the council is to obtain financial support and hopefully provide a footpath along the A1075 to Watton. Negotiations are still ongoing, The Chairman welcomed Councillor Karen Weir, a replacement for John Hardy and in so doing assured the public that she was already proving an asset to the council.

He then went on to thank the councillors for their continued support and made special mention of the Clerk Heidi, who has performed her duties in an exemplary manner, ensuring the council complies with all statutory obligations and is financially secure.

The public brought up the matter of traffic density and possible speed control through the village, this is one of the council's priorities for the coming year. The matter of the planning application for the proposed travellers site was also raised, the council had only that day been notified of this application / appeal and would attempt to discover the implications outlined in the correspondence.

At the close of the meeting refreshments were served, courtesy of Mrs Grace Rumsby and financed by the chairman.

PARISH COUNCIL AGM.

The meeting convened at 9:00pm with the election of Chairman and Vice Chairman. The current Chairman Cllr Rod Rumsby indicated he wished to stand down from the chairmanship. Karen Weir was proposed as Chair and Tim Birt as vice chair. These proposals were supported unanimously by the councillors.

Matters arising from previous minutes – Potholes, have been reported. Trees in Crown Crescent are awaiting inspection by an arboriculturist. There can be no Deer warning sign as we are not near a deer park or well established breeding area. Re-routing of Konnect service 11 through the village, not approved. Watton Town Council have forwarded application forms to receive a grant of £500 from the Town Council, Cllr Weir to action.

The accounts were studied, approved and necessary documentation signed.

The council agreed the clerk should investigate the implications arising from the documents received regarding the Otterwood Kennels planning and appeal.

Payment of Clerk's expenses, membership fees, ICO registration, Internal audit fees and insurance premiums were approved and cheques signed.

There was no public participation and the meeting closed at 9:45pm.

So, looking forward, I will be from time to time doing more 'village walkabouts' so if you have anything you feel the parish council needs to be aware of but aren't brave enough to come to a meeting, you can let me know.

We live in a very close knit community, supporting each other to the best of our abilities, so let's keep that going!

Two boys problem

There are four equally probably ways of having two children, girl-boy, girl-girl, boy-girl, boy-boy. The question states that one child is a boy, so the 'girl-girl' option is eliminated. Thus only one of the three options is the probability of the other child also being a boy, so the answer is: 1/3.

Three box problem

Your original selection gave you a 1/3 chance of being correct, that has not changed. The non-selected boxes collectively had a 2/3 chance of holding the prize, however one of those has been eliminated so that cumulative probability is now in the only remaining non-selected box. You should change you choice to this box.

Our minds play tricks and many people find it difficult to change their choice despite the maths demonstrating that this is the best option. What is often overlooked is that the host could have opened the box with the prize, if so the game would already be lost.
