At the meeting on 31st October the PC formally agreed to adopt the village phone box (at a cost of \pounds 1), which will be decommissioned and then used to house the village defibrillator.

Traffic issues were again significant on our agenda with an idea to team up with other parish councils to buy a 'shared' vehicle speed activated road sign (SAM2). We also considered teaming up with Shipdam PC on a Community Speed Watch and considered the merit of a traffic mirror at the cross roads (The Street, A1075).

Councillors agreed to make a number of small grants to support organisations and activities which are of direct benefit to the village including: Citizen's Advice Bureau, Ovington PCC for grass cutting, First Response, Each, East Anglian Air Ambulance, Accident Rescue Service.

Next meeting is 16th January @ 7:30pm in which the budget for 2014 be considered and the precept set.
