Rod has provided the final rainfall figures for February at 70mm or 2.75". Last year was only 35.5mm or 1.4", so this year we can classify February as 'wet'. March thus far is only 6mm or 0.25", whereas last March was 57mm or 2.25". There is no pattern, or is there?

More earth science: the vernal equinox occurred on 20 March at 16:57, so we now have more light than dark.

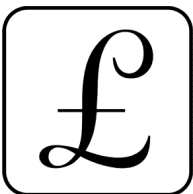
