## Recycling

The more observant among you will have noticed the revamped textile recycling bank outside the village hall. Breckland have recently changed over to Cookstown Textile Recyclers who send around 65% of the materials for re-use in Africa and Asia, while the remaining 35% are sent to pulping mills in the UK. The rate of

payment (which goes to village hall funds) is roughly the same as before. Although the wording on the bank itself says "Clean usable clothing only", they will also accept: shoes, bed linen, towels, curtains, belts, handbags, hats and scarves. Everything must be clean and, in the case of shoes, bags and hats, usable. Please make sure that all items are in carrier bags so that they remain clean.

# Ovington Speed Watch Team

The combined forces of the Ovington and Shipdham speed watch teams spent a day with year seven pupils at Wayland Academy on July 8th, where a speed awareness day was being held.

This was organised by our local Community Police Officer, PCSO Tonya Winsley, and involved the students, all 140 of them, being made aware of the dangers and consequences of speeding.

Students were involved in in-house activities and competitions, but for them, and to us speed watch operatives, it seemed that the highlight of their day was a chance to come out onto the roadside and operate the speed guns.

We were pleasantly surprised at the enthusiasm of the youngsters when using the speed watch kit, and some of their ideas about how more speeding motorists could be educated was quite enlightening.

Hopefully this enthusiasm will stay with them in the years ahead. Some were disappointed that more people were not caught speeding but the sight of twelve high vis jacketed youngsters accompanied by similarly clad speed watch team members, plus the obligatory police presence was enough to kill off any desire for motorists to exceed the speed limit.

The teams thoroughly enjoyed their day and felt quite satisfied with the students' eagerness to learn new tricks.

This sort of activity does not occur very often, but the Ovington team would welcome anyone interested in spending an hour a month in deterring speeding motorists through our Village.

The Parish Council are used to getting requests from the public asking "What is being done about speeding?" Here's a chance to do something towards making our Village a safer place, join our team.

## **Parish Council**

A report based on the unconfirmed minutes of the Parish Council meeting on 2 July.

#### **General**

The Council was please to receive a report from PCSO Winsley, who reported the crime figures for May – one 'domestic incident' and one 'violence against person'.

#### **Matters Arising** (from previous minutes)

There has been no reply from Highways requesting rectification of the surface of the trod. Clerk to take legal advice from NALC, Zurich and Nicholas Hancox.

Three "no dog fouling" signs have been purchased and are ready to install on confirmation of location.

#### Correspondence

An FOI request has been received about the committee structure of the PC, but we suspect it is actually checking how well the FOI response is conducted – gold stars are expected for Ovington.

A new round of 'Parish Partnership' bidding for jointly funded projects between the County Council and Parish Council. The Clerk will investigate if a bus stop at the Ovington Crossroads would qualify. This would fit nicely with Konect bus route 11.

The Parish Council responded in to a request for information from 'What Watton Wants", a group who want to develop a neighbourhood plan for Watton.

A request was received from residents for a Community Car scheme. We understand there are early plans for a community car scheme in Shipdham which Ovington could join. Further details and investigation is needed.

A suggestion that an online village forum could be useful. Initial consideration suggest that a village forum on the Ovington website might be successful. The software is free with a server cost is likely to be in the region of £25. There was discussion and it was agreed that a Facebook page might be more popular. Karen will create a Facebook page.

#### **Actions**

It was agreed to purchase an additional dog waste bin for Carbrooke Road. The Clerk will request a license to place it on highways land.

We have purchased our own litter pick equipment, following successful grant application. We are considering the best way to distribute and use these tools.

The accounts were reviewed and cheques signed.

#### **Future Event**

To consider organising a scrap cart 'gravity race' community event. The Clerk reported that a road closure would require a Section 16A road closure which would cost approximately £36. There was discussion about the practical issues surrounding the event and other organisations who might like to be involved. The provisional date was agreed as 30 May 2016, subject to further consultation.

### **Next meeting**

3 September, in the committee room of the Village Hall. Councillors usually arrive 15 minutes early for informal discussion. All are welcome.
