

A report of the meeting on 30 March, from the unconfirmed minutes.

Matters Arising from Minutes

Consideration of the A1075 speed restriction is now delayed as the officer responsible at Norfolk County Council is no longer in post.

Planning

3PL/2016/0310/HOU (12 The Street) – No objection, Councillors felt the similar frontage fits in well with its neighbour.

3PL/2016/0210/F (Red Roofs King Row) – Councillors recognised that this development would tidy an otherwise scruffy site. However, there were concerns over road access to A1075 and that housing targeted towards those with mobility impairment is neither sustainable nor appropriate for this site which is a considerable distance from local services.

NALC membership

Councillors felt that in light of the current internal difficulties within the *Norfolk Association of Local Councils* it did not provide value for money. PC to suspend membership, to be reviewed again next year.

Ovington Quiz


