Please continue to use the suggestion box in the Surgery for constructive comments – they are always considered at the next PPG (Patient Participation Group) meeting, these meetings are held approximately three monthly. From December through March, there were 221 missed appointments, which amounted to 3576 minutes lost. Please let the Surgery know as soon as possible if you can not make an appointment, someone else will be glad of your slot.

Report (derived from unconfirmed minutes)

- Arrangements for the annual village litter pick were finalised. A request for help from the village hall committee will be made to assist organising the 'post-picking' refreshments. If anyone has a contribution, please take this to the village hall on Saturday morning.
- Norfolk have made some repairs to road and street furniture, however the hole has reappeared at the junction between The Street / Church Rd / Carbrooke Rd. TB volunteered to repaint the black and white stripes on the new galvanised signpost after the finish has oxidised.
- Barnham Broom have offered to buy our time-share of the SAM2 speed sign. The sign has proved difficult to keep in good repair so councillors were agreeable, especially as there may be an opportunity to use an old SAM sign.
- There was a lengthy discussion about the 2017 Wacky Scrappy Gravity Race and tasks were divided up between Councillors and the Clerk.

A more lengthy discussion took place after the meeting, covering some key Breckland Council issues especially focused around local services, the Planning department and the 'Local plan'.

Seven local junior schools have sent over two hundred pupils of various age groups to take part in the interesting fun curriculum we have prepared for them. They leave clutching onto various things they have made or designed, but we have managed to retain some to put on display in the church.

A revolving display of many aspects of the work carried out by the children is there for inspection by all. Little stained glass windows are on display in the plain glassed church windows, drawings and stories of all ages are in folders making interesting reading. Two large friezes are to be a lasting memory of the project in the church, with the large one depicting the seasons around the church and the pupils' personal interpretation which is strongly encouraged

We are having a Refresher Day on Thursday 18th May 10:00am – 12:00 if you would like to come along and see if you would like to join in please do. For members of the village who are unable to help but would like the opportunity to see what happens when the pupils are on-site there is the opportunity.
