The paper £5 notes will be withdrawn from circulation on May 5th.

The only £5 note that will be legal tender after this date is the polymer £5 featuring Sir Winston Churchill, which was introduced in September 2016.

You can continue spending the paper £5 note, which features a portrait of Elizabeth Fry, until May 5th after this date you can exchange them at the Bank of England in person or by post.

Parochial Church Council

Mary Davey (Treasurer to Ovington PCC)

Whilst Ovington Parish church of St John's is undergoing a major restoration of the building and fabric, thanks to a ring fenced grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), we still need to cover our operating costs. The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is most grateful to all in the village who help with the HLF Project and are particularly grateful for the much valued time and effort which Messrs Hardy and Springford devote to the Project. The PCC are also most grateful for the support and effort of the many people who help with church fund-raising events.

Whilst the Project goes forward in leaps and bounds to ensure that there will be a place of worship and community in the village for future generations, the PCC still need to cover the operating costs of St John's. In 2016 the church's outgoings were £6,975, which is the equivalent of £134 per week just to open the doors as it were. With rising costs, it is anticipated that this will increase to something like £150 per week in 2017. With an average congregation of 14 people on Sunday mornings, it is a monumental task to achieve just sufficient income to cover this amount. Therefore the PCC is now reluctantly appealing for more donors from the village to help raise funds to help cover operating costs.

How can you help? Well, the most effective way is by donating a regular monthly amount by direct debit or envelope to 'Ovington PCC', failing that by a cash or cheque donation. Furthermore for every donor that is a tax payer the PCC can reclaim 25p in the pound from the tax-man providing that the donation is Gift Aided.
