
Allotment Association Supper Evening

'North Ovington' Trod update

The slow motion process has moved to the next phase with "formal acceptance of your Parish Partnership Scheme for local highway improvements for 2018/19". There is no work date yet, but the PC will be pressing for it to be completed by the summer.

The following report is produced from the unconfirmed minutes of the meeting held on 6 March:

Planning

3PL/2018/0055/F – A revision to access to existing plan for 3 bungalows just outside the village at the west end of The Street.

As an immediate neighbour, Cllr Birt declared a personal interest with the potential for it to be perceived as pecuniary and left the meeting for this item.

Councillors objected to the plan. In addition to the previous comments Councillors raising concerns around access onto a very narrow 60mph road and that the site is outside the settlement boundary.

Data Protection Regulation

The new GDPR regulations come into force in May. Policies were reviewed and updated to comply with the new regulation. Councillors confirmed that data processing is 'occasional' and that Article 30(5) applies.

Risk Assessment

The risk assessment for our village litter pick will be reviewed and updated for this year.

Financial

The Clerk presented the year end financial details. Payments were reviewed, authorised and cheques signed.


