Matters arising

The (WWI) memorial trees have been planted in Crown Crescent and fitted with tree guards and small plaques. The variety is American Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*) which has a very open canopy.

Planning

The refusal of application 3PL/2017/0904/F: (Building adjacent Alston Farm, Dereham Road) is being taken to appeal. The PC agreed its previous comments still apply.

3PL/2018/1135/HOU: The Old Mill House, Carbrooke Road. The PC raised no concerns.

Finance

Councillors reviewed accounts, the precept position and signed cheques. Details of receipts and expenses are reported in minutes.

A discussion about the budget (and precept) for 2019/20 resulted in amendments and revisions to the working spreadsheet. As the decision is not required until February it was agreed to defer the decision until January to allow for further consideration.

Other business

Following an insurance recommendation the PC will need to complete a tree survey formal inspection by an Arboriculturalist.

Churchyard Burials

There is a common misconception that, when a loved one is buried, the grave space has been purchased; this is not the case. The money paid is for the right to be buried there, not the actual burial ground, that space still belongs to the Church. In order to ensure that you and the Church know what your rights are regarding the grave, the Church of England has published a document entitled "Churchyard Regulations". This document should be available on the notice board of every parish church (I say 'should' because they sometimes go missing!), it is also available online at Diocese of Norwich website:

www.dioceseofnorwich.org/churches/registry/churchyards/

These regulations are written in law and if your Rector / Vicar is found to contravene these regulations, they could be taken to court and possibly lose their living.

It has been brought to the attention of your Parochial Church Council (PCC) that there is a grave within Ovington churchyard which contravenes the Churchyard Regulations. We do understand why this sort of things happen; civil cemeteries come under completely different rules, so people see different rules being applied and assume they cover everywhere. Before placing anything on a grave, including vases and ornaments, but especially fences, chippings or coverings, permission has to be sought from the governing body. However, as we cannot give permission for anything outside of our regulations, permission is unlikely to be granted.

We have tried to reach the family of the grave which contravenes our regulations, but they have moved away from the village. If anyone knows how they can be contacted, please could you let a member of the PCC or the Rector know.
