The trip to Gressenhall has been rearranged for Tuesday 10 September. You will be contacted nearer the time with reference to transport arrangements.



Parish Council (PC)

The weather was so pleasant we moved outside the committee room to hold the PC meeting in the open air. The Clerk and Councillors were joined by three members of the public.

This report is derived from notes, the official position of the PC is defined in the minutes.

Co-Option

Pete Bate of 8 The Street was co-opted to the PC. He signed his acceptance of office and was provided necessary 'Declaration of Pecuniary Interest' forms.

Planning

Councillors had already viewed applications online and had no additional comments for 3PL/2019/0543/HOU and 3PL/2019/0652/VAR

It was noted that 3PL/2019/0448/HOU and 3PL/2019/0543/HOU were approved by the planning authority (Breckland Council).

Finance

Following a catalogue of difficulties it was agreed to transfer the PC bank account from Barclays to Lloyds. A transfer instruction was signed by all Councillors and ex-councillors present.

Councillors reviewed the financial position and noted the precept has been received. Payments were reviewed and cheques signed.

Policy Documents

Subject to some minor amendments four policy documents were formally adopted and will be available on the website:

Internet Banking Policy, Complaints Procedure, Community Engagement Strategy and Media Relations Policy

Community Emergency Plan (CEP)

The CEP is a database in two parts, first those who might need assistance in an emergency such as power cut, closed road, flood, etc. The second part is a contact list of those with equipment and expertise to help in such an emergency. Data protection requires that information held is secure and used properly.

The Clerk presented a plan template from South Norfolk. TB indicated

that Breckland were also starting to develop the concept too, however Councillors did not wish to delay and will proceed with the template.

Public Participation

A discussion ensued around which areas of the road verges needed to be cut back. For the most part the new policy of NCC Highways to only cut the verges once per season was seen as a good thing, however the corner of Church Road (at Waterend Fm) and the junction between The Street and A1075 were flagged as safety concerned due to limited visibility.

I understand dogs need some outside time but to leave them out for two or three hours seems rather inconsiderate!


