
The Ovington Oracle

The rainfall for July was concentrated during the early part of the month, overall the total was 56.5mm or 2.22".

The amount so far for August is 68.5mm or 2.7", most of which fell on 16th, this amounted to 52mm or 2". Compared with other villages in this area we got off pretty lightly, nearly 152 mm or 6" was recorded over Stanta training area. As I write this we still have another week to go in August, so anything can happen.


Our events organiser has been very busy rearranging these events for next year, where she has been able and we hope to run something every month starting from January.
