Parish Council (PC)

A report derived from the unconfirmed minutes of the PC meeting held on 19 July. [Abbreviations: BDC – Breckland District Council]

Present: Cllrs Karen Weir (KW), Pete Bate (PB), Timothy Birt (TB),

Dave Welsted (DW) and Jeremy Woods (JW).

In attendance: The Clerk, DC Crane.

Correspondence:

Highways sent an invitation to bid for Parish Partnership (50:50) funds 2024/25.

BDC have Fly Tipping signage to purchase. Councillors considered that it may have unintended consequences by highlighting fly tip areas.

BDC have mobile deployable fly-tip surveillance cameras, but Councillors didn't think we have sufficiently regular instances to warrant a camera – this will be reviewed if the situation changes.

Planning Applications:

- 3PL/2023/0711/F: Agricultural Holding Rose Farm, Installation of a new highway access to the site and subsequent closing of the existing access. The Parish Council support the improvement of access onto the site. They request the condition that the verge is made good when the existing access is closed.
- 3PL/2023/0513/EU: The Bungalow, Water End Farm, Church Road
 Confirm residential use of The Bungalow. No PC comments

Planning Notifications:

- 3PL/2023/0280/F: Barn adj Alson Farm Erection of dwelling. APPROVED by BDC
- 3DC/2023/0189/DOC: Chanticleer, Dereham Road Discharge of conditions on 3PL/2021/0241/F. ACCEPTED by BDC

Payment of Accounts and Precept update:

Consideration of rent for parish land due to increased charges to the PC.

It was agreed that as there has been no increase in rent, it would be increased by £50 per annum for both the Allotment Association and the private tenant from April 2024.

Councillors agreed two donations for the financial year

- Air Ambulance £100
- CAB £100

Councillors reviewed and agreed payments to be made (list on website).

Village or Highways issues:

JW shared the results of the traffic survey, a copy of the data to be held within Parish records.

There was discussion around purchasing signs saying '20 is plenty'. Clerk to investigate costings and report back.

A resident requested the 30 mph zone be extended to cover the existing 40 mph in the eastern side of The Street in Ovington. Clerk to contact CC Bowes and Highways.

KW reported that some residents have experienced issues with their post being damaged and opened before being delivered. TB to investigate the complaints procedure for Royal Mail and inform KW.

It was noted that the Parish Council noticeboard is being used by residents for flyers which are not being approved by Council first. It was agreed that TB would put a notice on the board and in The Oracle to inform people to contact TB or KW before any notices are placed.

It was noted some time ago that an Oak Tree (with TPO) had been substantially trimmed and part of an ancient hedge removed within the parish. BDC were involved and action was to be taken following the two contraventions but more than a year has passed without action; PB has been chasing Breckland Enforcement for action. It was agreed that the Parish Council would support PB if he does not receive an update in the next two weeks.

To review agreements issued by the PC:

It was agreed that the tenancy agreements be standardised going forwards.



Recipe of the Month

Sam's easy (no bake) Key Lime Pie

Ingredients

For the base (use a loose bottom cake tin or a spring form for easy removal):

- 200g ginger nut biscuits (some prefer digestive) perfectly fine
- 50g butter

For the filling:

- Juice and zest of 5 limes
- 1x 397g can of condensed milk
- 1x 300g double cream

Method

Place the biscuits in a strong plastic bag and using a rolling pin crush the biscuits until fine crumbs.

Melt the butter in a pan (take off the heat) and add the biscuits, mix well and place in the bottom of your cake tin. Press down evenly and put inside the fridge to cool.

For the filling you can use a food mixer or a hand mixer

In a bowl pour in the condensed milk, the juice of the 5 lemons and the zest and simply whisk together for a few minutes then add the cream and whisk for a few minutes more.

Pour the mixture over the cooled biscuit base and place back into the fridge to set (up to 1-2hrs). You can decorate the top as you please I like to cut after dinner mints into 4 pieces and place around the edges points up, the mint chocolate and the lime go well together.
