April, did you know ...?

- It is now the fourth month of the year, but that's only by the Gregorian calendar that we use now. It was previously the fifth month in the earlier Julian calendar.
- April originally only had 29 days, but an additional day was added when Julius Caesar established the Julian calendar.
- April is named after the Latin verb "aperire" meaning 'to open', as we see with the opening of buds and flowers.
- If the clouds disperse April is a good month for meteor showers. The Lyrids meteor shower appears between 16-25 April. The Eta Aquariids meteor shower that can be seen onwards from 21 April, although it is most active in early May.

The clocks change on Sunday 31 March, being spring the clocks 'spring' forward an hour thus giving us lighter evenings.

Funeral Celebrant

Happy April, one and all!

Let's move on to life celebrations; and what does that actually mean? Firstly, a bit of background information ...

A funeral can cost quite a lot of money. A burial perhaps slightly more than a cremation. So direct funerals are becoming popular. More purse friendly.

A direct funeral is where the deceased is collected, taken to a crematorium then the ashes returned to the family. It's unattended, but your family member is always retreated respectfully and with dignity. This choice is sometimes made as the funeral can take place at a more suitable time, or perhaps quickly.

But with this type of funeral there is no service. Here is where a celebrant comes in. We can lead a service called a life celebration.

Having a celebrant take the service leaves you free to enjoy the moment. And it's all done with your wishes and input just like a traditional crematorium service. The main difference being it can be held wherever you want. A beach, pub, village hall, your house or up in a hot air balloon! You can have as many people there as you like. We can do music, videos, photo slide-shows, memory walls. Again, whatever you feel is an appropriate celebration to reflect the life of your loved one. And it's not time sensitive. This can take place when you're ready. Maybe you have family that live far away but visit once a year. They would want to come so organise it for when they are around. A month after the loved one has passed, 6 months, a year. It's up to you.

Many lives were lost during the pandemic and nobody could have a wake. Some people, our family being one, had very small funerals. Perhaps this kind of celebration of life would be perfect for you or someone you know. Until you know about them, how can you book one?
