The curious moon in May:

May is a good time to observe *earthshine*, sometimes called *ashen glow*. This is where light reflected off the earth illuminates the unlit portion of the moon surface. It is best observed a few days before or after the new moon on 8 May.

Full moon, on 23 May, is appropriately known as the *Flower Moon* in the northern hemisphere due to the abundance of wild-flower blooms.

The Anglo-Saxon name for the May

full moon is *Milk Moon* from the Old English "Rimilcemona". It means three-milking month because cows were milked three times a day at this time of year.

The Celtic and Old English names of the full moon are: Mothers' Moon, Bright Moon, Hare Moon, and Grass Moon.

Fruit Shortcakes

Ingredients:

4oz Margarine

4oz Sugar

6oz Mixed dried fruit

8oz Self raising flour

1 egg

Method:

Norfolk

WILDLIFE

Rub the fat into the flour then add the sugar, fruit, and egg. Mix to a stiff dough then roll out to about 1 inch thick and cut into rounds.

Bake at 180°C until done, approx 15 to 20 mins. You can add grated orange rind or mixed spice for more flavour if you wish.
