A report from the unconfirmed minutes of the January meeting:

Present:

Cllrs David Welsted (DW), Pete Bate (PB), Tim Birt (TB), Karen Weir (KW) and Krissy Marwood (KM).

In attendance:

The Clerk, District Councillor Helen Crane and County Councillor Claire Bowes and 1 member of the public.

Matters arising:

The hedge at the junction of Church Road and The Street has been cut back.

District Councillor Reports:

Circulated prior to the meeting and available on the web-site.

- Car Parks Business Rate: Cllr. TB raised that currently, business rates are paid by Breckland but Breckland are able to claim back part of those rates. When car parks go to the Towns, will there be financial aid from Breckland to cover the business rates or will Breckland keep the money?
- CC Claire Bowes discussed problematic parking outside of schools.
- Cllr. TB queried the “tax hike” in CC Bowes’ report which claimed “the average town or village pub could face an additional £6,000-£7,000 per year in business rates” as this was significantly higher than a recent report by the trade body *The Caterer*. CC Bowes to confirm the figures.

Correspondence:

- Tree inspection on Glebe Land – this work will be happening in the near future.

Planning matters:

- Update on Otterwood Farm – Cease and Desist was sent to the farm, but there are still many caravans on the site.
- Ref: PL/2026/0046/HOU
A two-storey rear extension following demolition of existing conservatory at 22 The Street.

There was a brief discussion over this application, but the PC took no view.

Reviewed by Councillors and agreed unanimously.

Highways or Village Issues:

- There was a discussion over Breckland owned land assets in the village which may be available for the PC to adopt. There will be no charge for the land but legal fees will most likely need to be covered by the Parish Council. As the land assets in Ovington are near the Parish Council play area, it was suggested that Ovington PC look into taking both sections of land. Clerk to liaise with Breckland to see what the process is.
- National Speed sign is fallen down at the junction of The Street and the A1075 alongside the last fallen down sign. Clerk to report both to Highways and request it be fixed.
- Village Litter Pick preferred date 21 March – Starts at 10:30am, meet at the village sign, equipment provided.

Future Business:

Adjournment for public participation:

Speeding and potholes continue to be a concern.

The 'grip' drain digging tractors with Highways seem to be doing more harm than good, digging too deep and putting in too many. Clerk to reach out to Highways to see if this can be addressed.

St Valentine

There is a saint who is remembered in February who I think will be known to you, whether you are attached to a church or not. I am referring to Saint Valentine, whose day is of course 14 February, de facto saint of romance. I hope it is (will be/was) a day that meets your expectations. I used to work with an Irish nun, and I once asked her, on the day, how many cards she had got. She said: "Sure, only the four". It is good that life can be surprising.

Churches, including the Church of England, tend not to mark St Valentine any more in worship. I don't think that is the Church being a killjoy (although that danger is always present). Rather it's the admission that we don't really know enough about the historical person. It is likely that there was someone of that name who was killed for his faith in third-century Rome, as that was a period and place of persecution. But these days we tend to remember people we can say more about.

It happens that other saints are commemorated on 14 February in the modern calendar. These are St Cyril and St Methodius. They were brothers who lived in the ninth century. They were missionaries to the Slavic peoples, to "Greater Moravia", which then extended from parts of Germany to Ukraine. They immersed themselves in the culture (as good missionaries always do), and over time were able to devise an alphabet which best served their languages. If you think of the Russian alphabet (also used in, say, Bulgaria), it is also called the "Cyrillic" alphabet, and, yes, that is after Cyril.

I dare to say that such diligence is itself a form of love, differing though it does from romantic love. Indeed, the very word "diligence" comes from a Latin word for love. There is wisdom in thinking of love in such broad terms. A job – any job – treated with care and craft can become a vocation, a vocation practised with nothing less than love. If, then, I say that I hope you find other ways of loving, or ways of loving more, this year, I hope and trust I will not be misunderstood!
